New KY Graduation Requirements For Current 8th & 9th

Begins with Class of 2023 (current 9th graders)

KY State Requirements: Most of the required course credits remain the same

English	4 credits: Eng 1, 2, and 2 credits aligned with the ILP
Math	4 credits: Alg 1, Geo, and 2 credits aligned with the ILP (Algebra 2 for Pre-College Curriculum)
Science	3 credits: At least 1 aligned with the ILP
Social Studies	3 credits: At least 1 aligned with the ILP
Health/PE	½ credit of Health + ½ credit of Physical Education
Visual & Performing Arts	1 credit: Can be a performance class (Art, Band, Chorus) <i>or</i> Introduction to Humanities class
Electives	6 credits aligned with the ILP; For pre-college curriculum, 2 credits of the same World Language are required (Spanish)

Additional KY Graduation Requirements

- Complete 1 of 8 graduation qualifiers (NEW!!)**
- Pass 100 question civics exam
- Receive instruction in financial literacy
- Demonstrate competency in essential skills and technology
- Successfully complete the Senior Project *(This is the one requirement LCHS has that's beyond the state requirements)*

NEW Graduation Qualifiers (*Must Complete ONE*)

1. Complete pre-college curriculum (minimum state requirements but includes Algebra 2 & two credits of the same World Language)
2. Benchmark score in one section (English, Reading, Math or Science) of a college admissions test (such as ACT or SAT) or placement exam (such as KYOTE)
3. Earn 3 dual credit hours of a KDE-approved class with a C or higher
4. Complete 1 class and corresponding test meeting the following criteria:
 - a. Advanced Placement (AP) with a score of three or higher
 - b. Cambridge Advanced International (CAI) with a score at or above benchmark
 - c. International Baccalaureate (IB) with a score of five or higher
5. Earn an industry certification as approved by the KY Workforce Innovation Board
6. Earn 4 credits from classes within a single KDE-approved career pathway
7. Complete 2 years of a state approved pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship
8. Complete a KDE-approved process to verify 500 hours of exceptional work experience or alternative requirements as outlined in a student's Individual Education Plan (IEP).

New KY Graduation Requirements For Current 8th and Beyond

Graduation Pre-Requisite (*Class of 2024; current 8th*)

The graduation prerequisite requires students to demonstrate basic competency in reading and math in one of three ways before graduation:

1. Score at least Apprentice in reading and math on the 10th-grade assessments
 - a. May retake the assessments twice each year in 11th & 12th grades
2. Score at least Proficient on the 8th-grade assessments for reading and math
3. Complete a collection of evidence submitted to include the following:
 - a. The student's ILP, including a student transcript;
 - b. If applicable, the student's IEP, including evidence that the student has received specially designed instruction and related services in reading & math;
 - c. Student performance on the required state assessments;
 - d. Appropriate interventions, targeted to the student's needs, to ensure support was provided to the student;
 - e. Student work demonstrating the students' competency in reading & math;
 - f. The student's post-high school plans.

5-Year Planning Tool

- This tool will help students plan ahead to fit in all of the classes they need within their high school years.
- It's important to also think about ALTERNATE classes just in case you are not able to get into some of the specific classes you request
- A variety of online classes are available. Counselors can help with these options. Why take an online course?
 - Take a class we do not offer on site. Example: You want to take Latin instead of Spanish, or you want to take a dual credit college class such as Psychology.
 - Take an extra class during the year or in the summer to free up a spot in your schedule for something else. Example: You can take Health online and work on it outside of school hours so you have room to take another elective during the school day.
 - Two classes you need are offered at the same time. You can take one online instead.

What is dual credit?

- Students receive high school and college credit for a class.

How much does it cost?

- FREE: Students receive up to 8 Work Ready Scholarships and up to 2 Dual Credit Scholarships
- Students pay the dual credit rate for *additional* classes. It is $\frac{1}{3}$ of KCTCS tuition. This year, it is \$169 for a 3 credit-hour class.

How do students take dual credit classes?

- They must register for classes at the high school and college level.
- They must meet the requirements. See the counseling office webpage.

Launch Point Academy--PURPOSE

- Increase student access to dual credit opportunities and seamless postsecondary pathways
- Allow students to earn industry recognized credentials
- Provide students Work-Based Learning (WBL) experiences
- Include pathways leading to the top 5 industry sectors, as identified by the Kentucky Center for Education & Workforce Statistics (KCEWS)
- Employer-driven, with Business & Industry partners providing direction in pathway decisions and Work-Based Learning experiences
- Provide all-day learning environments that include both CTE and academic courses

Student Selection Criteria

Space is limited. The following criteria will be considered to make selection decisions.

- Scholastic Achievement
- Attendance
- School Discipline Referrals
- Future Plans

Students who are interested in the program will submit an application. The 20-21 application will be available at Career Launch.

Once accepted, students will be allowed to continue the next year as long as they maintain acceptable achievement, attendance, and behavior.
